Notes for Ambrose Waterhouse Barnes:

Also referred to Ambrose as Ambrose Whitney Barnes of Bakerfield, Franklin, VT.

Also lived in New Jersey.

In 1840, he started himself in business. He built a large business in the manufacture of chairs which were sent to all parts of the country, to California by Clipper ship in 1849 and after. For many years this business was located at 144 Chatham St., New York City, NY. Afterwards it moved to 438 Pearl St. where bedroom furniture was added to the line. Here was where he took his oldest son Ambrose into partnership. His business was located at East Brooklyn which was known as Williamsburg at that time. For a time he lived at East Orange, NJ. He died of apoplexy while visiting his half-sister Martha Elizabeth at the old homestead, Bakersfield, VT.

Notes for Elizabeth Littell:

Died at 595 Putnam Ave in Brooklyn. She was interred in Green-Wood Cemetery.

Notes for Joshua Barnes:

Joshua and Mary lived in Brookfield, Massachusetts until about 1790. They then moved to Cambridge, Vermont around 1795, where they lived for about two years. Next, they moved to Bakersfield, Vermont (about 12 miles away) where Joshua had been improving a piece of land. Joshua served in the American Revolution as a Bombardier in Captain William Todd's Company, Colonel Craft's Regiment of Artillery, in 1776. Served at Bennington under Capt. Daniel Gilbert. He served from February 1 to May 8, 1776, a total of 3 months and 7 days. The estate of Joshua Barnes was settled in the Probate Court at St. Albans, Vermont in March, 1814, before the Honorable Frederick Bliss, Esq., Judge of the Court of Probate for the Georgia District (Franklin County). Named in the will as his heirs were Mary, Salley, Comfort, Jonathan, Cyrus, Hannah, Minnie, Elijah, and Benjamin F. Barnes. Total value of the estate was \$2,816.56 in personal property and real estate.

Notes for Benjamin Franklin Barnes:

Benjamin was a farmer and was a member of of the Methodist-Episcopal Church. Census records indicate his residence in Enosburgh, Vermont in 1820, as head of family. He was taken by his parents to Cambridge, Vermont around 1795, and later to Bakersfield, Vermont. Census records indicate Benjamin was identified as a head of family in Dickinson, New York from 1830 through 1850. He served in the War of 1812 under Captain George Kimball's Company from Fairfield, Vermont and was stationed at Swanton in 1813. Another source show a Benjamin Barnes (no middle initial shown) among the list of men from Bakersfield, Vermont, who volunteered and were at the Battle of Plattsburgh on September 11, 1814. Whether this was a subsequent assignment of the same Benjamin Franklin Barnes cannot be determined with certainty, but the related facts suggest it as a definite possibility. It is interesting to note that in the roster of men in the Fairfield Company in which he is known to have served, was a John Johnson. Benjamin was mentioned in the will of his father, Joshua Barnes. He served in the Army on a ship on Lake Champlain. He and one brother settled in Barnes Corners, New York. Civil War Veteran.

Notes for Thomas Barnes:

Thomas served in the Last French War (French and Indian War) as a corporal in Captain Robinson's Hardwick Company from Brookfield. Muster roll was dated March 10, 1756. He served from April 10 to October 12, 1755 in Col. Ruggle's Regiment to Crown Point. His total service was 26 weeks and 4 days. Thomas died of small pox at Jonah Barnes home.

Elijah served (enlisted at 16 yrs) in the American Revolution as a private in Captain Sylvanus Walker's Company, Colonel Timothy Danielson's Regiment. He ordered a bounty coat or its equivalent in money on October 31, 1775 in Roxbury.

Applied for Pension 9 Oct 1832, Herkimer Co., NY.

buried at FAVILLE PECK or SHERWOOD CEMETERY - Town of Manheim 2 MILES N. WEST RTE 83 DOLGEVILLE

Letters of Administration issued to Lucy (X) 6-1-1839, File # 00336

Heirs: Widow, Lucy and Jonathan Barnes - Manheim; Elijah - Manheim; Issac Barnes - Oppenheim, Montgomery Co.; Franklin Barnes - Delaware Co., Ohio; Calvin Barnes - Manheim; Lucinda, Wife of Samuel Sherwood - Cazenovia, Madison Co.; Grand-children of deceased and children of Nancy, wife of Daniel Lobdell; viz. - William, George, Elijah, Charles - minors under 21 of LeRoy, Jefferson Co.

In 1793 moved to Herkimer County to a farm of 300 acres for 300 pound sterling (lot #16 of Glens Purchase to Gilbert Colden Willett), located to Manheim, about 4 miles north of Little Falls, located about half a mile east of the road leading from Little Falls to Burrell's Corners on the road leading to Dolgeville. His deed is on file at Herkimer County Historical Society.

Notes for Lucy Hunter:

Widow applied for Widow's Pension, Herkimer Co., NY, 5 Feb 1840.

Notes for Moses Barnes:

Moses served in the American Revolution as a private in Captain Ithamar Wright's Company, which marched on the alarm of Lexington on April 19, 1775. He returned home May 1, 1775--a total service of 15 days.

Received several grants in Brookfield, the last recorded in January 1755.

He served as a PVT. in Capt. Jabez Upham's Company and was wounded, for which he received monetary compensation on January 28, 1757.

Notes for Nathan Barnes:

He served in 1758 during the French and Indian War in Capt. William Paige's Company of Hardwick and in 1762 in the Company of Capt. William Shepard. He marched from Brookfield on April 19, 1755 under command of Capt. Jonathan Barnes, serving 16 days. He later served for 8 months under Capt. John Packard, and again in April 1778 enlisted for 9 months service, receiving a bounty of 100 pounds and the "use of a blanket". In 1818, he received a pension for his Revolutionary War Service.

Notes for William P. Barnes:

One of 49 Minute Men who signed a covenant enlisting himself for a term of 6 months under the command of Capt. Joseph Gilbert. The date of the agreement was November 14, 1774. He is found in a company commanded by Capt. Daniel Gilbert at the Battles of Bennington and Half Moon between July 13 and September 2, 1777. On April 20, 1778, he was still in the same company, having reenlisted and received a bounty of 100 pounds and a blanket. In June 1818, he received a pension for his service in the Revolutionary War.

xi. Elijah Barnes (son of Moses Barnes and Hannah Olds) was born on 12 Feb 1753 in Brookfield, Worcester, Massachusetts, USA. He died on 14 Jul 1816 in Barnard, Windsor, Vermont, USA. He inherited part of the Indian Plantation lands of Marlborough from his father in 1697 and was involved in a title dispute to his land (as were his neighbors) until 1719 when the courts finally recognized the validity of the deed of purchase of these Indian lands obtained by the residents of the plantation area. Like his father, he was active in community affairs and he was a leading resident of Brookfield. Thomas and his son, Samuel, were chosen town assessors in 1718. Thomas acquired considerable land through grants and later, purchases, and ultimately owned 1100 acres in all. Assessed property valuation, circa 1717, was second only to that of the famed Col. John Pynchon. Thomas Barnes' tax rate was 4 pounds 8 pence, and John Pynchon's tax rate was 5 pounds, 5 shillings. The next highest assessment, just below that of Thomas Barnes, was that of John Hamilton, Sr., who had an assessment of 3 pounds, 17 shillings, and 8 pence. Thomas was one of eight men commissioned to build a sawmill in the town of Brookfield--the first in the town. For this, each of the eight men received a grant of 40 acres of land. House and goods destroyed in King Philip's War by the Indians March 20, 1676. In 1691 received a grant of 40 acres in Brookfield, Mass. where he built. Bought other lands and held in all 1100 acres. He was a leading citizen of Brookfield. His house was the stopping point of the Committee when on duty at Brookfield and expenses were granted to his wife. Late in life he lived with his son Comfort north of Ditch Meadow Swamp. Gored to death by a bull. "...was tossed by a bull and his bowels torn out, a few days ago, age d about 70. - Boston Newspaper of May 16, 1734."

Thomas's Marlborough house and goods were destroyed by the Indians in Philip's war, and because of same he was awarded a home lot of 40 acres in Brookfield for the second settlement effort in 1691.. Prior Brookfield had also been destroyed by the Indians at great loss of life. Moving to Brookfield, Worchester,Massachusetts in 1691,during its second settlement, were Thomas and Mary, with Thomas's brother William, where Thomas became a leading citizen, and was granted considerable land. His first recorded grant was on August 27, 1691, for eleven acres at the junction of Five and Seven Mile Rivers, in what is now East Brookfield. In 1692, he was one of the signers of a petition to the Great and General Court (the Massachusetts Colonial Legislature) requesting that the Committee for Brookfield (governing body of the as-yet-non-incorporated town) be granted authority to confirm or deny present or former grants so that those who owned land could be made to bear their share of the tax burden and the cost of supporting or acquiring a minister. This was granted. . He inherited part of the Indian Plantation lands of Marlborough from his father, Thomas Sr., in 1697. In 1699, Thomas BARNES purchased the land of Richard COY, west of Foot's Hill. He received a land grant in 1701. In 1703, he and Samuel OWENS purchased the land of Thomas PARSONS, from the first settlement of Brookfield, on the Hill. Also, in that year, he purchased the rights of John SCOTT of Suffield to the land of John AYRES. In July 1710, six men were murdered by the Indians and apparently enough damage was sustained that Thomas and others petitioned the general court for relief. He was involved in a land dispute with his land (as were his neighbors) until 1719 when the courts finally recognized the validity of the deed of purchase of these Indian lands obtained by the residents of the plantation area. Thomas acquired considerable land through grants and later, purchases and ultimately owned 1100 acres in all. Assessed property valuation, circa 1717, was second only to that of the famed Col. John Pynchon. Thomas Barnes' tax rate was 4 pounds, 8 pence and John Pynchon's tax rate was 5 pounds, 5 shillings. Like his father, he was active in community affairs and he was a leading resident of Brookfield. Thomas and his son, Samuel, were chosen town assessors in 1718. In 1709, Thomas was one of eight men commissioned to build a sawmill in Brookfield, on Sucker Brook at what was later called the Malt

Mill bridge in the town of Brookfield - the first in the town. For this, each of the eight men received a grant of 40 acres of land to be divided among them, for their encouragement to build a new mill, and they had liberty to cut all sorts of lumber in any part of the town for the use of the mill. In 1710, BARNES and four others petitioned the Great and General Court for a grant to repair the gristmill dam, stating that Indian troubles made it impossible to travel 30 miles to the nearest gristmill, and furthermore, winter was coming. In 1713, BARNES and two others reported to the town that the owner of the gristmill was not living up to the terms of his contract, and had forfeited his grant of land and mill rights. On September 18, 1714, the Committee for Brookfield appointed Thomas BARNES and two others as members of a special commission to settle a dispute between the minister and his neighbors over a plot of land. In 1718, he was elected an assessor of the town, and in 1719, after the incorporation of the Town, he and his son Samuel were both elected to the first Board of Selectmen and also to the first Board of Assessors. (The five members of both Boards were the same!) In December of that year, he and the other selectman petitioned the Great and General Court for confirmation of a plot of eight square miles denoting the boundary of the town and granting of township privileges, which was granted. He also owned land in Hardwick, as well as a sawmill in New Braintree, for which he received a grant of 40 acres. He was a leading citizen of Brookfield. His house was the stopping point of the Committee when they were on duty at Brookfield and expenses were granted to his wife. Later in his life, he lived with his youngest son, Comfort, north of Ditch Meadow Swamp. Thomas died in Brookfield on April 23, 1734, after been gored by a bull! Notes for Jabez Olmstead:

And in the first place, I do commend my Spirit into the Hands of God who gave it, and my Body to a decent Burial, the rites of which to be performed in Such manner, as Shall be that to be best by my Executrix; and as to the Worldly with which God has blest me I do dispose of it in manner and form following.

(Imprimis?) After my Debts and funeral Changes are paid, I do give and bequeath unto my well beloved wife Martha, all my personal estate, of what nature or kind Soever, forever.

Item I do give her the improvements of one third part of my real estate during her

natural Life, and I do also give her the improvements of my whole estate, till my Son Moses comes of age.

Item. I do give and bequeath to my Son Moses all my real estate upon his paying the legassies hereafter mentioned.

Item. I do give and bequeath to my son Jeremiah five Shillings lawful money to be paid by my son Moses when he comes of age.

Item. I do give and bequeath to my Son Israel five Shillings lawful money to be paid by my son Moses when he comes of age.

Notes for Jabez Olmstead:

Was in Brookfield by 1713 and on 13 August 1714 received a grant of eighty acres, and later of eighty-one acres. He owned in all three hundred and fifty acres which he sold on 9 July 1729. Moved to Ware, where he was a first settler, and built a mill at the Falls.

In 1745, Capt. Olmstead commanded the 10th Co. in Col. Samuel Willard's 4th MA Reg. against Louisburg. The fact that he held a commission disposes the myth of his being part American Indian.

He served in the military French and Indian Wars from MA. "In 1736, seven years after his removal from Brookfield to Ware, we find a petition of Jabez Olmstead of Ware River praying for a grant of province land "in consideration for his good services in the late Wars against the French and Indians, and the Wounds he has received with the expense he has been at for the cure of them." It was ordered that 200 acres be granted him of the unappropriated lands, provided he returns a plot within twelve months for confirmation, and provided the petitioner, his heirs or assigns, "build on the premises within three years a house 18 feet square at the

least, and 7 ft. stud, and break up or bring to English grass five acres, and fence the same." In 1738 Olmstead prays for further time, "as through some disappointments he has not been able to lay out the same within the time limited." It was ordered "that the time be extended 12 months from the present, and two years to fulfill the conditions of the grant."

He owned a Saw and Grist Mills 1729 in Ware, Hampshire Cty, MA.

He sold his house in Brookfield on July 9, 1729 and moved to Ware. Where he erected a home on the West side of the Ware River above the Village. Later there was a 2-story home built known as the "Great House" where a leach was used to produce potash.

He signed a Will dated 4 Feb 1751/52 in Hampshire Cty, MA.

In the Name of God Amen, I Jabez Omsted of Ware-River in the County of Hampshire and Province of he Massachusetts Bay in New England, being of lawful Age and Sound Mind, this Day calling to mind my own mortality, do make this my last Will and Testament, revoking all former Wills, or anything of that Nature or kind, by me heretofore made. And in the first place, I do commend my Spirit into the Hands of God who gave it, and my Body to a decent Burial, the rites of which to be performed in Such manner, as Shall be that to be best by my Executrix; and as to the Worldly with which God has blest me I do dispose of it in manner and form following.

(Imprimis?) After my Debts and funeral Changes are paid, I do give and bequeath unto my well beloved wife Martha, all my personal estate, of what nature or kind Soever, forever.

Item I do give her the improvements of one third part of my real estate during her natural Life, and I do also give her the improvements of my whole estate, till my Son Moses comes of age.

Item. I do give and bequeath to my Son Moses all my real estate upon his paying the legassies hereafter mentioned.

Item. I do give and bequeath to my son Jeremiah five Shillings lawful money to be paid by my son Moses when he comes of age.

Item. I do give and bequeath to my Son Israel five Shillings lawful money to be paid by my son Moses when he comes of age.

Item. I do give and bequeath to the Children of my Daughter Thankful Brown deceased five Shillings lawful money to be paid by my son Moses when he comes of age.

Item. I do give and bequeath to my Daughter Hannah Marsh five Shillings lawful money to be paid by my son Moses when he comes of age.

Item. I do give and bequeath to the child of my Daughter Hammond deceased five Shillings lawful money to be paid by my son Moses when he comes of age.

Item. I do give and bequeath to my Daughter Dorcas Wolcot five Pounds lawful money to be paid by my son Moses when he comes of age.

Item. I do give and bequeath to my Daughter Sarah Marsh five Pounds lawful money to be paid by my son Moses when he comes of age.
