Notes for John Jay Knox:

In 1811, John Jay Knox moved from Montgomery County, New York to Oneida County to settled in Cook's Corners, which later became Knox Corners and finally Knoxboro in 1863. He was a successful merchant and banker. He owned one of the largest general stores in Oneida County, New York. He was a co-founder of the Bank of Vernon, and served as its president until 1862. He also owned and had interests in several other businesses. John Jay Knox was also active in the New York State Militia. He was appointed brigadier general in 1826 by Governor DeWitt Clinton. In addition to his commercial and military pursuits, he also served on the Board of Trustees at Hamilton College from 1828 to 1876. For thirty years he was the Senior Trustee and President of the Board. He was a powerful and influential man. He was twice a presidential elector: once for William Henry Harrison and once for Abraham Lincoln (second term).

Notes for Sarah Ann Curtis:

Sarah Ann Curtis(s) was descended from many of the most ancient families of Connecticut. For example she was descended from Thomas Curtis(s) (1594-1681), who was one of the original settlers of Wethersfield, Connecticut; from John Curtis (1577-1640) who was one of the original settlers of Stratford, Connecticut; from John Parmelee (1612-1687), who was one of the original settlers of Guilford, Connecticut; and from Adam Hurd (1611-1672) who was also one of the original settlers of Stratford, Connecticut. Knox engaged in active and successful mercantile and manufacturing business. He and others established the New York Lock Company in 1861 and manufactured locks for several years. James C. Knox was the first postmaster of Knoxboro after the office was established in about 1850. An interesting note: In 1862, James C. Knox issued private notes for 5 cents, 10 cents, 25 cents and 50 cents, which were good in his store.

He was a trustee of Hamilton College, 1876-83, and received the degree of D.D. from there in 1865.

Died-In Oswego, N. Y., December 17, 1890, Charles Rhodes, in the 75th year of his age. The above announcement will be received with deep regret, not only in this city, but throughout the State. For several years the friends of Mr. Rhodes have noticed the encroachments of age and the evidence of declining life. In March last, Mr. Rhodes was stricken by paralysis, from which he only partially recovered. About two weeks since he suffered another stroke, and it then became apparent that the end was near. For several days he lay unconscious, and at five o'clock this morning he passed away so peacefully and painlessly that "They thought him dying when he slept, And sleeping when he died."

Notes for John Jay Knox Jr.:

John Jay Knox, Jr. graduated from Hamilton College, New York in 1849. He began his business career as a clerk in the bank at Vernon, New York, of which his father was president. He was subsequently, for brief periods, cashier of a bank at Norfolk, Virginia and of one at Binghamton, New York. He conducted a private banking business at Saint Paul, Minnesota with his brother, Henry M. Knox, 1856-62, and in January, 1862, he wrote an article for Hunt's Merchants' Magazine advocating the establishment of a national banking system, with the circulation guaranteed by the government. This article attracted the attention of Secretary Chase, and Mr. Knox was given a position in the U.S. Treasury Department. His suggestion resulted in the national bank act, passed Feb. 25, 1863. He had charge of the mint and coinage correspondence in the Treasury Department, 1866-73, and made an examination of the U.S. branch mint at San Francisco. His report was published in 1866. He subsequently discovered in the Office of the Treasury of the U.S. mint at New Orleans a defalcation of \$1,000,000. and he took charge of the branch. He was Deputy Comptroller of the currency under Secretary McCulloch, 1867-72, and he was Comptroller, 1872-84. While Deputy Comptroller he prepared a bill for the discontinuing of the coinage of the silver dollar. With the help of the director of the mint, on June 25, 1870, he reported the bill with the opinion of scientific experts to Congress, and it was ordered printed. In 1873 Henry R. Linderman used this bill, and the opinions attached, as the basis of the "Coinage Act of 1873". Mr. Knox was made an ex officio member of the assay commission in recognition of his services. He accomplished the sale of the 3 percent bonds. He was president of the National Bank of the Republic, New York City, 1884-92; the Republican candidate for Comptroller of New York City, 1887; a member of the finance committee of the New York Chamber of Commerce; a trustee of Hamilton College, 1884-92; a member of the American Banking Association, of the Union League and University Clubs, and of the Century Association. He received the honorary degree of L.L.D. from Hamilton College in 1890. On Jan. 16, 1890, he made an elaborate argument in favor of a permanent national bank circulation before the banking and currency committee of the U.S. House of Representatives. He is the author of: Annual Reports of the U.S. Treasury (1872-1884); United States Notes: or a History of the Various Issues of Paper Money by the U.S. Government (1894); and A History of Banking in the United States, left incomplete and published by his wife.

Charles Eugene Knox attended Hamilton College and received an A.B. degree in 1856 and an A.M. degree in 1859. He attended Auburn Theological Seminary from 1856 to 57 and graduated from the Union Theological Seminary, New York City, in 1859. He was licensed by the presbytery of New York in 1859, was a tutor at Hamilton College, 1859-60; was acting pastor of the Reformed Church, Utica, New York, 1860-62; stated supply at Oswego, New York, 1862-63; at Morristown, New Jersey, 1863-64; and was ordained by the presbytery of Newark, New Jersey, June 8, 1864. He was pastor of the First Presbyterian church at Bloomfield, New Jersey, 1864-73.

In 1869, Rev. Charles E. Knox founded the German Theological Seminary of Newark, New Jersey under the auspices of the Presbyterian Church. The roots of the College and its mission can be traced back to 1868. With the influx of nearly two million German immigrants following the European Revolution of 1848, it became necessary to establish a training school for German-speaking ministers. In 1872, the school relocated to Bloomfield, New Jersey, occupying the home of the former Bloomfield Academy at Franklin and Liberty Streets. That structure stands today as Seibert Hall. Knox Hall was erected in 1914 to commemorate his work there. Charles E. Knox was the President of German Theological School for 30 years, until his death in 1900.

He received the honorary degree of D.D. from the College of New Jersey in 1874. He is the author of: Year with St. Paul (1863); Love to the End (1868); David the King (1874); a course of graded Sunday school text books in five numbers (1864-67); and reports, sermons and pamphlets.

Notes for Sarah Fake:

He returned to the United States in 1893, and was a stated supply and subsequently pastor of the Presbyterian Church at Rye, New York. He lectured on apologetics at the Union Theological Seminary, New York, 1896-99, and in the latter year was made Professor of the philosophy and history of religion there. He received the degree of D.D. from Princeton University in 1888. He continued as a Professor at the Union Theological Seminary until he went to Korea in 1911, where he died in 1912. He wrote in both Japanese and English. In Japanese, he is the author of: The Basis of Ethics (1883), A Brief System of Theology (1884), Outlines of Homiletics (1885), Christ, the Son of God (1886), and The Mystery of Life (1890). In English, he is the author of: A Japanese Philosopher (1893), The Christian Point of View (with Francis Brown and A. C. McGiffert) (1902), The Direct and Fundamental Proofs of the Christian Religion (1903, 1908), Japanese Life in Town and Country (1904), Imperial Japan (1905), The Spirit of the Orient (1906), The Development of Religion in Japan (1907), The Gospel of Jesus (1909), and contributions to periodicals.

BENJAMIN RHODES, M. Am. Soc. C. E. * Died August 12th, 1894. Benjamin Rhodes was born in Oswego, N.Y., February 25th, 1849, the son of Charles Rhodes, a prominent lawyer of that city. He was educated in the city schools of Oswego and at Hamilton College, Clinton, N.Y., from which latter he graduated with honors in 1871. He was valedictorian of his class and was a member of the Sigma Phi and the Phi Beta Kappa societies. Before entering college, and also during his college course, Mr. Rhodes was at various times connected with practical engineering work, being employed in the engineering departments of the Oswego and Rome Railroad and the New York and Oswego Midland Railroad. Upon completing his college course he again took up railroad work, and was for two years Division Engineer on the Lake Ontario Shore Railroad (now part of the Rome, Watertown and Ogdensburg Railroad). In 1874 Mr. Rhodes went to Niagara Falls, N.Y., accepting the position of Engineer and Superintendent of the New Suspension Bridge, in which capacity he served for eight years, at the same time pursuing a general engineering practice, giving particular attention to hydraulics and bridge construction. Two suspension bridges, 220-ft. span, connecting the Dufferin Islands in the Canadian Niagara Park, were constructed by him, as were several street bridges crossing the Hydraulic Power Canal in Niagara Falls. From 1875 till 1882 he was Engineer of the Niagara Falls Water Works Company, in the organization of which he took a very active part; and between 1877 and 1882, the Engineer of the Niagara Falls Hydraulic Power and Manufacturing Company. He was also instrumental in organizing the Street Railway Company of Niagara Falls, and was Engineer for the company, planning the system and constructing the first portion of the road to be built, being the line between the then villages of Niagara Falls and Suspension Bridge.

To Mr. Rhodes' efforts was due the introduction of electric lights into Niagara Falls in 1881. In that year he organized a company and built a plant for that purpose, it being one of the first electric plants erected for domestic lighting in western New York. From the time of its organization until shortly before his death Mr. Rhodes was Manager of the Brush Electric Light Company, of Niagara Falls, in which company he was a large stockholder. While connected with this company he was a member of the National Electric Light Association. At the annual convention of the American Society of Civil Engineers, in June, 1884, a paper by Mr. Rhodes upon "Electrical Transmission from Niagara" was read, which is of especial interest at this time, in the light of the subsequent extensive work which has been done with a view to developing and transmitting the power of Niagara Falls. Benjamin Rhodes was an upright, honorable man in all his work and dealings; a hard, earnest worker; was highly respected by all who knew him, and was a man having a large circle of friends, among whom he counted many of the best known men of the day in his chosen profession. He will be remembered by many of the members of the American Society of Civil Engineers who attended the late convention at Niagara Falls, as one of the active members of the Local Committee on that occasion. Mr. Rhodes was elected a Member of the American Society of Civil Engineers April 5th, 1882. His death occurred suddenly at Toronto, while in that city on

At the time, they were both living at 454 Riverside Drive in NYC. They returned from France on the SS "America" on a nine-day cruise from Cherbourg, France to NYC, USA.

Just one month after they returned from Europe for the third time, was the stock market crash of October 1929, which ushered in the Great Depression. It seems that their visits to Europe ended. The trips indicated that they had an affluent lifestyle that ended with the beginning of the Great Depression

In the spring of 1959, at age 73, Isabella traveled from NYC to England on the RMS "Queen Mary", where she stayed for three months.

(Austin Corbin was a railroad magnate of great fame and fortune.) Andre prepared for college at Saint Paul's School in Concord, New Hampshire. He attended Harvard College, from which he graduated in 1902. He also attended the Art Student's League in New York City for four years. Andre Cheronnet-Champollion was a gentleman, a scholar, and an artistic dilettante with talent in painting. Even though he had become an American citizen, in 1914 he felt it was his duty to help defend France against the German invasion. Thus, he returned to France and enlisted in the French Army as a Private. He was killed in battle in 1915.

Notes for Jay Knox:

Jay Knox's father, George William Knox, was a missionary to Japan. He and his family lived in Japan from about 1877 to 1893. In fact, several of the Knox children were born in Japan. George William Knox was a graduate of Auburn Theological Seminary in Auburn, Cayuga, New York. Despite the fact that they were stationed in Japan, the family must have returned to Auburn for a time in 1888, because, Jay Knox was born there on 23 May 1888. After Jay's birth, the family returned to Japan. Thus, other than his birth, Jay Knox spent the first five years of his life in Japan. When the family returned to the USA in 1893, Jay's father took up a post as a pastor in Rye, Westchester, New York from about 1893 to 1899. Therefore, Jay lived in Rye from about age 5 to age 11 years.

In 1899, George William Knox became a Professor at the Union Theological Seminary in New York City, a position he held until about 1911. During that time, the Knox family must have lived in the city, but they also lived in Pelham Manor, Westchester, New York, at least in 1905, when Jay was 17 years old.

In 1906, at age 18, Jay Knox enrolled at Hamilton College in Clinton, Oneida, New York. (Many people in the extended Knox family attended Hamilton College. And, in fact, John Jay Knox Sr. was a major benefactor of the college and was a member of the college board of trustees for forty-seven years and was its chairman for thirty years.) Jay graduated from Hamilton College in 1910.

In 1911, Jay's father embarked upon a missionary tour of the Far East. His intension was to visit

Korea, Japan, China, and India. The entire family went as far as Italy together, from where the children returned to the USA and the parents went on to Korea. (Unfortunately, George William Knox never made it beyond Korea, where he died of pneumonia in 1912.)

In 1910, Jay Knox enrolled in the Union Theological Seminary in New York City, from which he graduated in 1913. (He also concurrently earned a Master's degree from Hamilton College.) He was ordained as a Presbyterian minister in Westchester County also in 1913.

From 1913 to 1915, Jay Knox was an Assistant Pastor at the First Presbyterian Church of Morristown, Morris, New Jersey.

From 1915 to 1918, Jay Knox was the Pastor of the Union Presbyterian Church in Newburgh, Orange, New York.

On 26 August 1916, Jay Knox married Emma Lee Caldwell in Austin, Travis, Texas. He was 28 and she was 25 years of age. Emma Lee Caldwell was the daughter of Walter Haynie Caldwell and Mary Louisa Jones Caldwell of Austin.

Jay's and Emma Lee's first child, Emma Lee Knox, was born on 05 Dec 1917 in Newburgh.

At this time, the Great War was raging in Europe, and the USA had entered the war in 1917. At first, Jay claimed an exception from service. After all he was 29 years of age and had a pregnant wife to care for. He also volunteered on the home front in Newburgh. But finally, at age 30 years, he joined the Army in 1918 as a 1st Lieutenant and Chaplain. He did his basic training in Taylor, Kentucky. By the time he joined, the war was basically over, but there was still a great need for chaplains for the US soldiers in Europe. He served in France from 15 Nov 1918 to 30 May 1919. And he was discharged from duty on 02 Jun 1919.

While Jay was away in the Army, his wife and daughter lived with Jay's mother in New York City. And when Jay returned from France, he joined them there. He did not return to Newburgh, and in fact, he never served as a pastor anywhere ever again.

Jay's and Emma Lee's second child, Walter Jay Knox, was born on 26 Nov 1921 in New York City. After the war, it seems that Jay Knox drifted for a while. He lived with his mother from mid-1919 to mid-1922. Whether he had a job during that time is unknown. Then, in 1922, he moved with his family to Austin to live with or near his wife's mother. The 1924 Austin City Directory listed Jay Knox's occupation as "traveler".

The reason that Jay was unsettled (and perhaps unemployed) during this time is not known.

Perhaps he had become disillusioned by his experience during the war as was the case for so many others.

In any case, Jay Knox soon pulled himself together, and when he emerged he had chosen a new profession: that of banker. Of course, banking was in his genes. Both his great grandfather, John Jay Knox Sr, and his great uncle, John Jay Knox Jr, had been bankers of some renown. By 1930, Jay Knox and family were living in Haddonfield, Camden, New Jersey. And Jay was an Assistant Trust Officer at the First Camden National Bank and Trust Company in Camden.

Sometime before 1940, the Knox family had moved to the affluent town of Moorestown, Burlington, New Jersey, where Jay now owned his own home at 34 Lakeview Drive. He was still with the First Camden National Bank and Trust Company, but now he was a Trust Officer. Jay continued at the bank in Moorestown for some time.

However, by 1955, at age 67 years, Jay Knox had moved to Coral Gables, Miami-Dade, Florida where he lived at 1535 Zareta Avenue. At this time he was an Assistant Trust Investment Officer at the First National Bank of Miami. By 1958, Jay had been promoted to the position of Vice-President and Trust Investment Officer at the same bank.

In 1966, at age 78 years, Jay and his wife moved back to Austin where Emma Lee was born and raised. She died shortly thereafter (06 Apr 1967) at age 76 years.

About a year after his wife died, Jay Knox remarried, this time to Hayes Thomson (on 17 Feb 1968 in Austin). He was 79 and she was 76. (Hayes Thomson was the daughter of Rector McDonald Thomson and Mary Bell Bowers and the widow of Frank Herbert Davol.)

Jay Knox died in Austin on 24 Jul 1976. He was 88 years old.
