**RESERVATIONS AND FARE.** Accommodation cannot be definitely held until 10%, or more, of the full fare is received. The balance is payable not later than 42 days before sailing.

**CANCELLATION CHARGES.** If your passage has to be cancelled we must know as soon as possible in writing. There is a scale of cancellation charges which can be covered by a special Holiday Travel Insurance which is **not included in your fare.**

**TO HELP YOU,** our Voyage Information booklet is available to passengers.

**EMBARKATION.** Passengers are required to make their own arrangements to reach the port of embarkation. About a month before the sailing date you will be sent baggage labels and joining instructions.

**PASSPORTS.** All passengers must hold a valid passport and it is your responsibility to check whether you have the requisite (if required) visas.

**BAGGAGE ALLOWANCE** is 2 cubic metres or 500 kilos per adult—there is a scale of excess baggage charges. Baggage is defined as personal effects and not household furniture. We can accept accompanied cars between UK and RSA dependent on the commitment to carrying the Islands' cargo.

**SPENDING MONEY.** Sterling or Travellers Cheques may be used on board, but personal cheques cannot be accepted. We regret that the era of Credit Cards has not embraced us yet. Foreign currencies can be exchanged but only at the sole discretion of the Purser.

**SPECIAL FOOD.** If you require a particular Diet please let us know well in advance, otherwise it may not be readily available on board. Baby Food is supplied free of charge but please let us know your requirements, also in advance.

**CHILDREN** are part of any community, even sea-going ones. We cannot be responsible for them, but the ship has an indoor play area with adequate facilities. Their meal times are set before the Single Sitting for adults. Children under sixteen must be in the care of a parent, legal guardian or other adult passenger. In the latter case we require written authority.

**MEDICAL ATTENTION.** In case such is needed, *ST. HELENA* carries a British doctor. A charge is made for consultations, treatment, drugs and medicines because the ship is outside the scope of the British National Health Service.

In an age that takes air transport for granted the British Island colony of St. Helena is almost unique. It can only be reached by sea. When the Cape Mail Service ended, after 120 years, in late 1977, St. Helena was faced with a most vital problem. The small community of 6,500 citizens had to have a link with the world. The solution has been to place in service a specialised ship that, carrying their cargo and passengers, maintains St. Helena's link with the world.

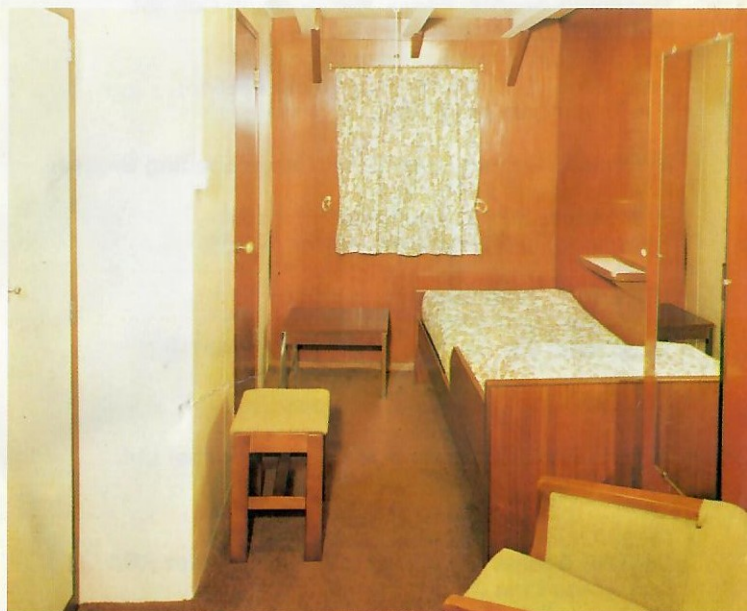
Colonised in the seventeenth century by the English East India Company as a replenishment point on their route to India, the Island of St. Helena is best known as Napoleon's place of exile. Except for modern communication systems it is, in a sense, as remote now as it was to the Emperor. Not many people are privileged to have met the friendly islanders who, with their origins from the East India Company days, are great travellers and famous seamen.

RMS *ST. HELENA* is the Island's ship. Found after a world-wide search, she has a rare combination of modern passenger accommodation built on to a cargo-carrying hull. She is a working ship; her primary role is to carry cargo cheaply, carefully and efficiently. No hollow world of the wandering cruise liner here—she carries the inter-island passengers (Ascension—St. Helena) and almost everything the islands need.

RMS *ST. HELENA* is small and straightforward. To make the best use of the hull, the accommodation block is aft; its modern layout gives as much space as possible to a maximum seventy-six passengers. Each air-conditioned cabin has its own shower, wash-basin and toilet. The ship's facilities are simple: a swimming pool, children's play facilities, a modest shop, a self-service laundry, a fully-stocked bar and a paperback library. The aim is for good, uncomplicated food.

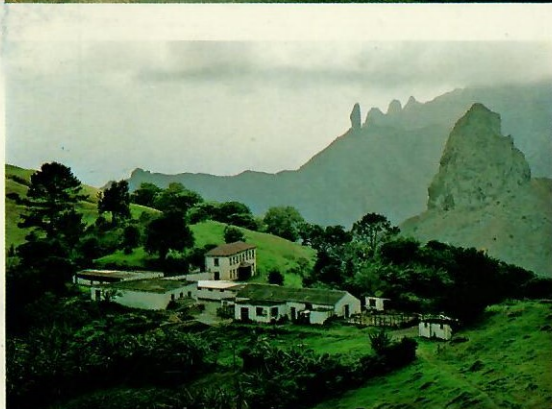

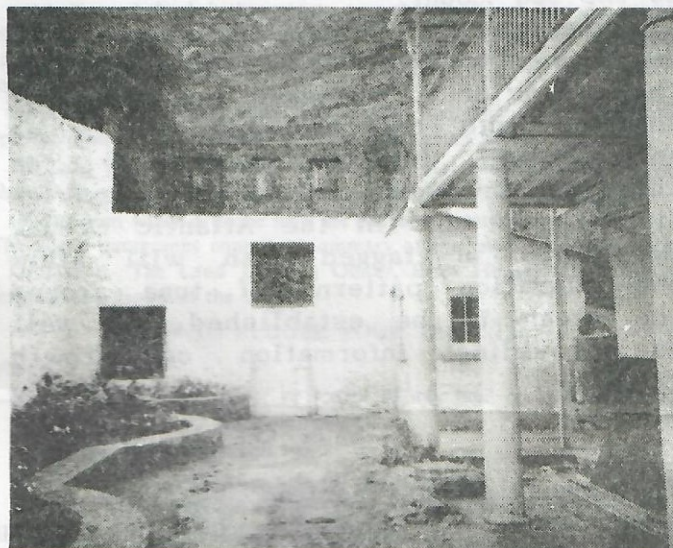

You will doubtless be aware that my successor is to be Miss Pamela Lawrence.

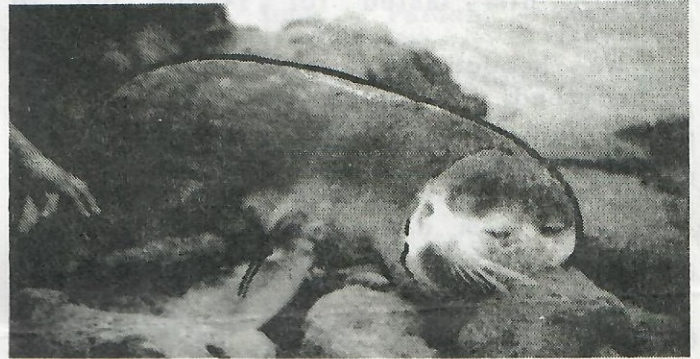


Pamela is currently the Librarian in the Jamestown Public Library; she was formerly a School Teacher. We wish Pamela every success in her new undertaking!

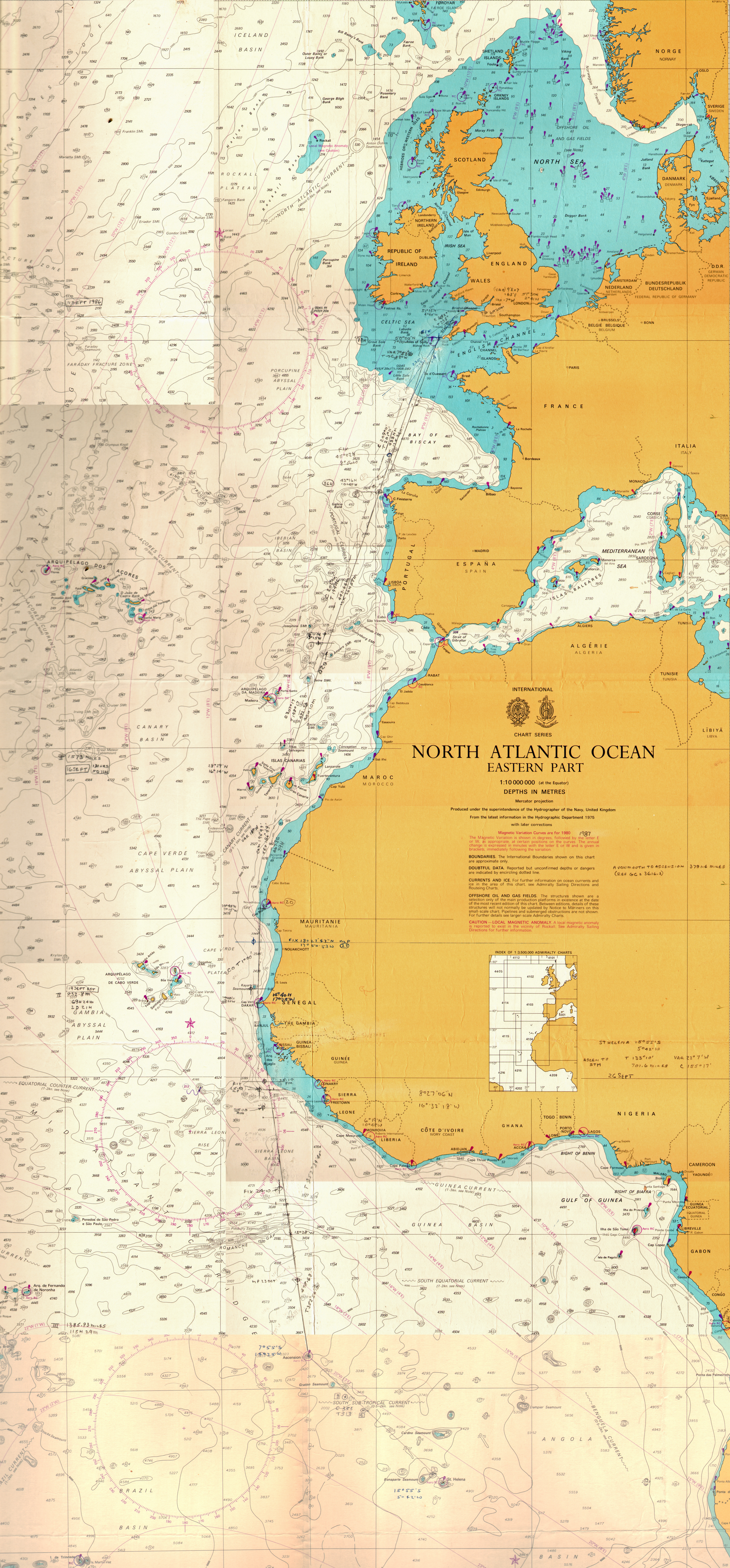

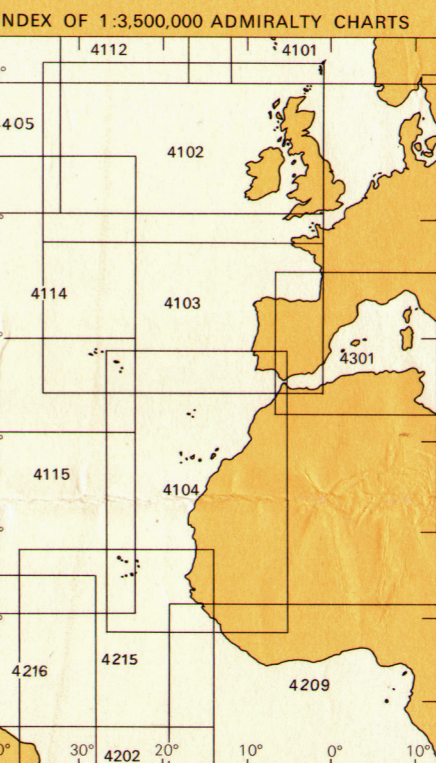
